



## **Rowing BC COVID-19 UPDATE**

February 19, 2021

### **Adult Rowing**

Outdoor sport activities for adults are restricted to 4 or less people, including a coach, organizer, or instructor. 3 meters of physical distancing is required at all times. If physical distancing is not able to be maintained the activity is not permitted. These restrictions apply to on-water rowing activities as well as land-based training. Adults, in this instance, are people 22 years of age or older.

### **Adult Household 2X/2-s**

Household 2X/2-s are permitted for adults living in the same household or private residence. If two people are rowing in a household 2X/2- they count as 2 people with respect to the gathering size, which is limited to 4 or less people, including the coach, organizer, or instructor.

### **Adults Living Alone**

The aspects of the PHO pertaining to adults living alone do not extend to a sport application. Adults who live alone are not permitted to row in a household 2X/2- with someone from a different household.

### **Children and Youth Rowing**

Children and youth sport activities do not have the same gathering restrictions that adults do. Children and youth are permitted to gather in group sizes of up to 50 people, including coaches, organizers, or instructors. 3 meters of physical distancing is required at all times. If physical distancing is not able to be maintained the activity is not permitted. These restrictions apply to on-water rowing as well as land-based training. Children and youth, in this instance, are people under the age of 22.

### **Children and Youth in Household or Dormitory Settings**

Children and youth living in the same household or private residence are permitted to be within 3 meters of one another in the sport context, and therefore are permitted to row in crew boats with one another. Children and youth living in dormitories are, in certain sport circumstances, permitted to be within 3 meters of one another, and may therefore be permitted to row in crew boats together. ### **Regattas**

Regattas are not currently permitted under the PHO, and as such are not currently being sanctioned by Rowing Canada Aviron through Rowing BC.
